1. Google Chrome

1. Open Google Chrome.
2. Navigate to the website you want to translate.
3. Right-click on the page and select "Translate to English" from the context menu.
4. If you don't see this option, click on the three dots in the upper-right corner, go to "Settings" > "Languages."
5. Ensure "Offer to translate pages that aren't in a language you read" is enabled.

2. Firefox

1. Open Firefox.
2. Navigate to the website you want to translate.
3. Firefox does not have a built-in translator. Install the "Google Translate" extension from the Firefox Add-ons website.
4. After installation, click the "Google Translate" icon in the toolbar.
5. Select the language you want to translate the page into.

3. Microsoft Edge

1. Open Microsoft Edge.
2. Navigate to the website you want to translate.
3. A prompt will appear at the top of the page asking if you want to translate the page. Click "Translate."
4. If you don't see this prompt, click the three dots in the upper-right corner, go to "Settings" > "Languages."
5. Ensure "Offer to translate pages that aren't in a language you read" is enabled.

4. Safari

1. Open Safari.
2. Navigate to the website you want to translate.
3. Click the "aA" icon in the address bar.
4. Select "Translate to English" from the drop-down menu.
5. If this is your first time using Safari's translation feature, you might need to enable it in Preferences.

5. Opera

1. Open Opera.
2. Navigate to the website you want to translate.
3. Right-click on the page and select "Translate to English" from the context menu.
4. If you don't see this option, go to "Extensions" and add a translation extension like "Google Translate."
5. Use the extension to translate the page.

6. Tor Browser

1. Open Tor Browser.
2. Navigate to the website you want to translate.
3. Tor Browser does not have a built-in translation feature. You will need to use an external translation service.
4. Copy the URL of the website.
5. Open a new tab, go to translate.google.com, and paste the URL in the translation box.
6. Select the target language and click "Translate."

7. Brave

1. Open Brave.
2. Navigate to the website you want to translate.
3. Brave uses the same engine as Chrome, so you can use a similar method.
4. Right-click on the page and select "Translate to English" from the context menu.
5. If you don't see this option, click on the three lines in the upper-right corner, go to "Settings" > "Languages."
6. Ensure "Offer to translate pages that aren't in a language you read" is enabled.

8. DuckDuckGo

1. Open DuckDuckGo.
2. DuckDuckGo is a search engine, not a browser, so it doesn't have built-in translation features.
3. Use a privacy-focused browser like Brave or Firefox with a translation extension.
4. Alternatively, you can go to translate.google.com and enter the URL of the website you want to translate.
